A Message from our President

Dear Community Member,

HealthReach Community Health Centers has a rich history as a community-based and patient-directed organization. For the last 48 years, our team of clinicians and support staff have delivered comprehensive healthcare services in some of Maine's most rural and medically underserved communities. In the vein of providing care for the whole patient – all under one roof – we have made some very exciting headway in 2022:

- We began offering a new service treatment for hepatitis C (HCV). Formerly, we referred patients who tested positive for HCV to specialty care. Now, some of our patients can be treated for HCV in their HealthReach medical home.
- We continued to expand our behavioral health (BH) services – including counseling, psychiatric visits, and medication support. From 2021 to 2022, we have seen an 8.1% increase in BH visits, and 13% increase in BH patient count. These figures speak to the incredible work that our teams are doing.
- With the need greater than ever, we continued focusing on the delivery of medication for opioid use disorder (MOUD, formerly known as MAT). Over 300 patients receive MOUD services from HealthReach. It is difficult to capture just how much this really means to our patients in rural Maine.

As we reflect on 2022, we also look forward to 2023 with passion and care for the people of rural Maine. There is no greater calling than to serve our communities and to help them achieve both health and wellness. Thank you!

SHIRLEY'S STORY Helping me get back to myself

A very special patient recently shared the story of her healthcare journey with both HealthReach and our partners at the Maine Primary Care Association. She loves sharing her story because she feels an obligation to help others - in particular, she says "destigmatizing mental health services is important to [her]." holistic HealthReach's approach to _ offering healthcare team-based, integrated primary care and mental health services – met Shirley's needs during a particularly challenging time in her life.

When Shirley first came to HealthReach almost a decade ago, she was admittedly in a rough spot. She was struggling through many undiagnosed illnesses – both mental and physical – and she knew she needed help to manage her pain. We quickly connected Shirley with Jeanne Stokes, Family Nurse Practitioner, at our Madison Area Health Center. Jeanne partnered with Shirley to address her physical concerns, while at the same time connecting her with the Behavioral Health Team.

After meeting with Kelly Bell Bragg, Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner, and Danna Lee, Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Shirley was soon diagnosed with bipolar disorder.

Kelly helped Shirley to find the right medications and dosages to manage the symptoms she was experiencing. Danna counseled Shirley in sorting through the challenges she was facing, helping her to prioritize and process them one by one. Cindy Kennard, RN, Care Manager, also began to regularly meet with Shirley to help her manage her diabetes and achieve her goal to lose weight. Cindy helped Shirley find healthy recipes she could cook at home using the only cooking appliance she owned: a microwave.

Before she received the coordinated care she needed, Shirley wasn't sure when she would be able to pursue her passions. She has come a long way since first finding her healthcare team.



Shirley says managing both the symptoms of bipolar disorder and the pain she previously experienced has "cleared [her] head." Shirley has since started personal projects that had been on hold – learning to play the clarinet, developing her talent for drawing, and pursuing college education.

Shirley appreciates her entire care team. She says she loves coming to the health center and being greeted by the familiar faces of the Madison Area Health Center team. Near the end of our interview, Shirley paused to collect her thoughts, then said, "I thought I had lost 'me'... but you guys found me!"



What Patients Are Saying

"My psychiatric clinician [is] very thorough. I never feel rushed. She listens and makes me feel comfortable to talk about symptoms I may be having. Mental health is tough. I have many years of experience with providers and she is an asset to the community."

"When I was in the exam room with the clinician, she was 100% present. She looked me in the eye and asked questions about my symptoms. Her physical exam was thorough. [<u>í] can't say enough good things</u> about her and the team."

"Everything went very well. I was respected, treated professionally, and felt informed through the entire process."

"It was a wonderful experience for an [urgent] visit. My son had an infection - he had an abscessed tooth... [his clinicians] were very caring, understanding, got him right in and took care of the problem"

"I feel this office is very helpful. All of my questions got answered by the receptionist. When I went in to see [my] clinician, she was very helpful and easy to talk to. I highly recommend this health center."


