At HealthReach Community Health Centers, we are proud of our 50-year history of providing consistent and quality care in some of the most rural and medically underserved areas of Maine. The HealthReach Board of Directors continues to provide strategic and measured counsel in a healthcare environment that faces both legislative regulatory changes and economic challenges.

## Bingham Area Health & Dental Center

When the only local healthcare provider in Bingham retired, the community got together and came up with a vision for a health center where everyone was welcome. Working together, neighbors helped raise funds to renovate a house, which they partnered with HealthReach to convert into a Community Health Center. After applying for federal funding to become an FQHC, Bingham Area Health Center, HealthReach's first site, officially opened. In 2004, Bingham Area Dental Center opened as an addition to the existing health center.

## DEALING WITH DEMENTIA TRAININGS

Belgrade Regional Health Center began offering educational classes for family members and caregivers of individuals with dementia in 2024, in partnership with Spectrum Generations. This year, these free, quarterly classes continued with the goal of increasing access to meaningful education and connection. Dealing With Dementia Training covers topics like self-care, boundary-setting, and behavior management, empowering caregivers with the knowledge, skills, and support needed to provide effective, compassionate care. We look forward to more connection and engagement in 2026!

# Care Rooted in Community



Late this summer, having heard about HealthReach's Connector Program, Rebecca Carter turned to Bethel Family Health Center's Hollie Vitale for life-changing support.

*"As of September 1st, I would no longer be able to use my caseworker, because I would no longer have MaineCare. But Hollie can do everything a caseworker can do, and more."*

Hollie, like all of our HealthReach Connectors, can help patients sign up for assistance with heating and food support programs, insurance, and so much more. Resources like these can make all the difference for rural Mainers. Like Rebecca, many Mainers are farmers, food service workers, or professionals in other fields that may not offer health insurance or other important benefits.

*"They say that we have a higher poverty rate in this area than the national average,"* Rebecca says. In 2024, 1 in 10 Mainers were living below the poverty line, a fact that Rebecca pointed out during our conversation. *"All those social agencies are getting really weighed down, so having Hollie here is huge."*

The best thing about the Connector Program at HealthReach, Rebecca says, is the ability to get help with important paperwork, and the support in knowing where the paperwork needs to go.

## Belgrade Regional Health Center

Nearly 30 years after its original opening date, Belgrade Regional Health Center required a capacity expansion due to its growing patient population. In July of 2006, with fundraising support by the local community board, the Belgrade community celebrated the grand opening of a NEW facility! Today, Belgrade Regional Health Center continues to be a vital resource for all of its patients, offering opportunities that include: caretaker training, walking paths behind the health center, and partnerships with local fitness programs.

“To be able to come in and meet with her if I need help...” she trailed off thoughtfully. “For me,” she said, “it’s her broad knowledge of the programs.”

Rebecca’s appreciation for the health center goes beyond the Connector Program. As a health center patient of over 40 years, she fondly recalls the community health center originally built in a local barn on Main Street.

“One of my most prominent memories is Jan Whitworth [a retired Bethel Family Health Center clinician] sewing me up. I caught a hay bale to my face, so I got a broken nose and a lot of stitches,” Rebecca recalls. “That’s the first time I really remember going to the health center.”

Bethel Family Health Center has supported Rebecca through all of the highs and lows of her life. The health center is where she found out that she was pregnant with her daughter, where she found respite in the care of her parents, and where she was supported through her cancer diagnosis.

**“It’s a very community-based place,” Rebecca says fondly. “When you have doctors who know you, then they know when something’s wrong.”**

She recalls calling her doctor with a digestive concern; “I was in there within a month and

got it diagnosed. If I hadn’t been able to have a practitioner that knew me, and knew what my health was doing, then I wouldn’t have been able to do that. I wouldn’t have been able to call somebody on the phone and say, ‘It’s a busy time of year for me, and I’m not going to be able to get into the health center, what’s the next step?’ I could send a picture on the Patient Portal, and they realized something was wrong.”

Rebecca’s story is one of many, and she noted that she refers many people to the health center — and to Hollie!

“I can’t count how many times that I brought somebody in here who’s in an emergency situation, and they come in here and they’re able to get through everything they need to.”

Hollie stepped in as a supporter in both Rebecca and her father’s lives, helping with day-to-day tasks, applications for support programs, and acting as an advocate for their needs.

“My dad ended up seeing the connection worker, and that probably added five years to his life. He was taking care of mom at home, and it was too much. He would have worked himself to death,” Rebecca said. “When he came here, the person made him feel heard; it’s a life saver.”

No matter who you are, or what your situation may be, our mission at HealthReach is to reach patients with the affordable, high-quality care that everyone deserves. Connectors help make this mission possible — offering no-cost assistance when patients need support. Whether you need information about forms and paperwork or just a familiar face and helping hand to organize monthly tasks, HealthReach’s Connectors are here for you.

## Richmond Area Health Center

In 1975, community members from the Richmond area joined together to create a nonprofit, local board, with the goal of bringing healthcare resources to residents of Richmond. The community held bake sales and other fundraisers, and after two years of hard work, the Community Board partnered with HealthReach to open Richmond Area Health Center in 1977! Since opening, Richmond Area Health Center has continued to be involved in local community events, including many years of organizing and hosting the Richmond 5K.

## Lovejoy Health Center

Since opening in Albion in 1978, Lovejoy Health Center has grown substantially. In order to accommodate an ever-growing patient population, the health center underwent important building updates in 2018, adding an extra wing to support expanded patient capacity, as well as a new, accessible entrance. Today, the health center is also home to HealthReach's Medical Records Department.

**Sheepsfoot Valley Health Center**

Opened in 1980, with the help of Dr. Roy Miller, HealthReach's longest serving clinician, Sheepsfoot Valley Health Center offers fundamental care and support programs to patients in Coopers Mills. Sheepsfoot also hosts Carol's Corner – a feature unique to this health center, where children can choose a book to take home. This library is dedicated to Dr. Carol Eckert, one of the health center's former clinicians, who dedicated her life and career to service as a HealthReach physician.

## Strong Area Health & Dental Center

Since opening in 1986, Strong Area Health Center has become an essential resource in its community. Hosting events like the yearly Pierpole Day 5K that raises donations for the center’s food and household needs pantry, the health center offers more than just medical care to patients. In 2003, Strong Area Dental Center opened as an addition to the existing health center to fill the care gap that the community experienced with a lack of local dental care.

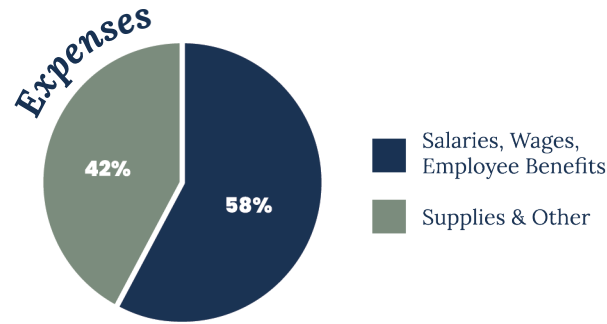
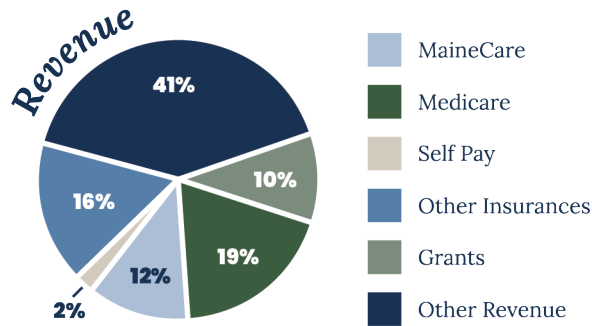

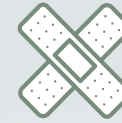

Not only do campers have the experience of a lifetime at Pine Tree Camp, but their caregivers also benefit from some much-needed respite while knowing their loved ones are at camp having fun!



## ANNUAL FUNDRAISER

In 2025, after a brief hiatus, we were happy to bring back our annual fundraising campaign. During the height of the pandemic, HealthReach leadership chose to pause the campaign, due to both the uncertainty surrounding the situation and the increased workload on all of our staff as a result of COVID-19. This September, we tied our giving campaign to a cause close to many of our hearts — pediatric care! In addition to their donation to the HealthReach mission, donors were given the opportunity to dedicate a percentage of their donations to Pine Tree Camp, an overnight camp experience for children with physical and developmental disabilities. Located in the Belgrade Lakes Region of Maine, Pine Tree Camp is fully accessible and offers life-changing experiences through barrier-free access to the outdoors.

## Lawrence High School "Bulldog" Health Center

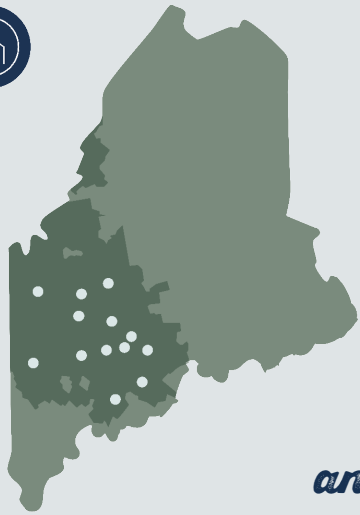
